Administer	Jim was sent in to administer the team, after the last manager quit. To direct or control (the affairs of a business, government, etc); To put into execution; dispense.
Babylon	The hanging gardens of Babylon is one of the seven ancient wonders of the world. The chief city of ancient Mesopotamia: first settled around 3000 BC.
Bailiff	The bailiff arrived at the house to serve the summons. The agent or steward of a landlord or landowner; A sheriff's officer who serves writs and summonses, makes arrests, and ensures that the sentences of the court are carried out.
